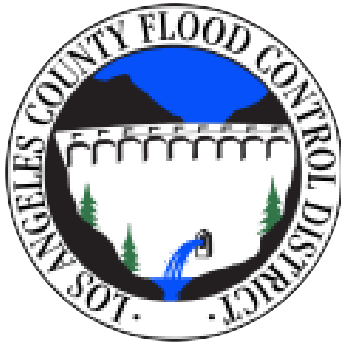

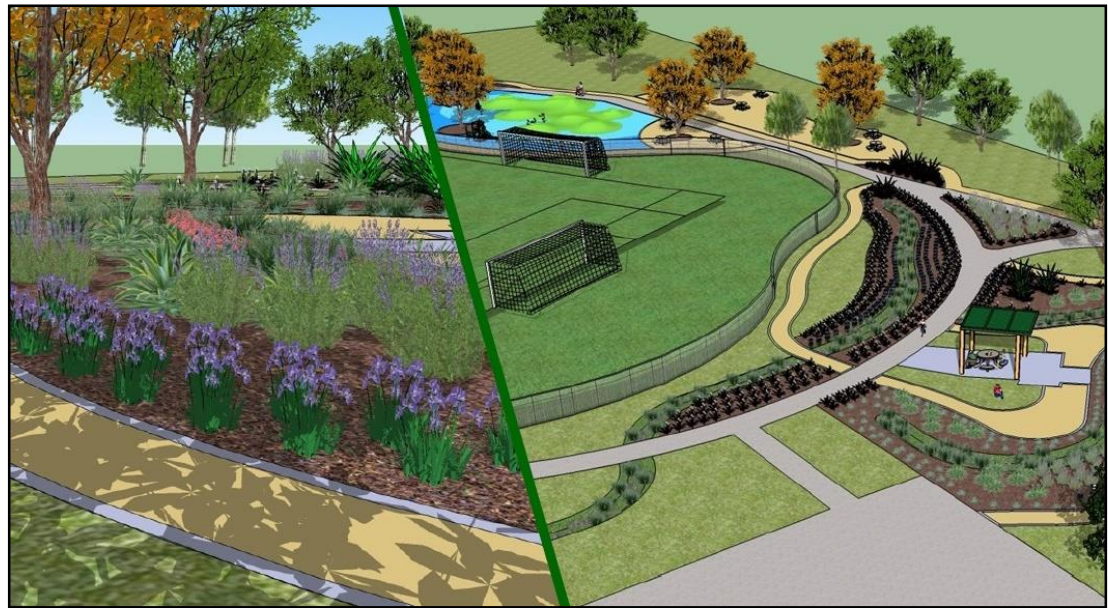

# Review: Threshold Eligibility Criteria

<b>Regional Program (50%)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• All projects must be watershed-based (per statute)</li><li>• Both centralized and distributed projects will be funded</li><li>• All projects must be multibenefit and include, at a minimum, <u>water supply</u> and <u>water quality</u> benefits</li></ul>
<b>Municipal Program (40%)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• All projects must be multi-benefit and include, at a minimum, a <u>water quality</u> benefit</li><li>• <u>Exception</u> to multibenefit requirement may be made for single-purpose water quality projects</li></ul>
<b>FCD Program (10%)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Program specifications TBD</li></ul>



# Program Definitions

1. Water Quality Benefit
2. Water Supply Benefit
3. Community Enhancement



# “Water Quality Benefit”

“Improvement in the chemical, physical, and biological characteristics of stormwater and urban runoff and/or protection of these characteristics in surface waters, rivers, lakes, streams and the marine environment.

Activities resulting in this benefit include:

- Infiltration or treatment of stormwater and urban runoff
- Nonpoint source pollution control”



# “Water Supply Benefit”

“Increase in the amount of locally available water.

Activities resulting in this benefit include stormwater capture for:

- Reuse
- Recycling
- Increased groundwater storage and available yield”

*Note: definition from AB 1180 statute*



# “Community Enhancement”

“A benefit in addition to water supply or water quality, such as:

- Improved flood management
- Creation or restoration of riparian habitat and wetlands
- Reduction of urban heat island effect through urban greening
- Improved public access and/or enhanced or new recreational opportunities along rivers, lakes and streams”

# Project Selection Criteria

Development of project selection criteria will build on threshold criteria, and may include:

- Prioritization criteria
- Weighting of various criteria
- Additional considerations e.g cost share
- Relationship to existing (or new?) plans



# Governance

Development of governance recommendations will involve several pieces of program administration:

- Who decides
- Role of stakeholders
- Project selection process
- Relationship of Regional, Local and FCD programs
- Oversight



# Credit, Rebates, or Incentives

Analysis of a crediting program is directed by the Board of Supervisors' motion. Purposes of an incentive, rebate, or crediting program could include:

- Rebates for work already completed
- Incentives for landowners to do their own projects
