



#### Exciting News: Safe, Clean Water Program Projects Underway!

#### Barnes Park in Baldwin Park

On 11 May 2024, the City of Baldwin Park held a groundbreaking ceremony for the Barnes Park Water Infiltration Project and Park Improvements. The project includes a water capture component and will provide significant community benefits, including enhanced recreational opportunities like futsal courts, basketball courts, and soccer fields. The park will also feature a new play station for kids and parks for big and small dogs. #### **Garvey Ave Streets and Drainage Improvement Project**

On 1 June 2024, the City of El Monte will hold a groundbreaking event for the Garvey Ave Streets and Drainage Improvement Project. This key infrastructure project will help alleviate much of the flooding in the avenue and help El Monte as it strengthens its water infrastructure. The project will help improve groundwater quality and will feature new bike lanes. The groundbreaking ceremony will take place at 12102 Garvey Ave in El Monte from 10:00 AM - 11:00 AM and it is open to all the community.

Disadvantaged Communities. Disadvantaged community location vs disadvantaged community usage.

Water Conservation. The best reserve of water is the water we don't use.



# 2. Community Feedback

Focus on Smaller Projects. Can the USRG focus on smaller projects while ensuring these fit into a large plan?

Vision of SCWP. Concern that SCWP is becoming a grant program in a narrow way-that is, applications should not be seen as independent.

Common concerns. Taxes, goals, disadvantaged communities, relationship to other programs/plans in LA County.
