



Safe, Clean Water Program Community Survey is Here!

The Safe, Clean Water Program (SCWP) is a pioneering initiative created with the approval of Measure W by LA County voters in 2018. The program provides dedicated funding to improve and expand LA County's water infrastructure system. It does so with funds collected annually through a special parcel tax which has resulted in the successful funding of infrastructure projects, scientific studies, and project concepts.

A key component of the SCWP is to listen and understand the needs of residents throughout LA County. Day One was selected as one of several Watershed Coordinators to help with outreach events, education activities, and to identify potential projects. To help with this effort, a new COMMUNITY SURVEY has been developed to gather community needs. All residents are encouraged to complete it and provide any input to help advance the SCWP.

WHAT ARE MULTI-BENEFIT **PROJECTS?**

SCWP projects must be multi-benefit.

Multi-benefit projects have a: 1) Water Quality Benefit, 2) Water Supply Benefit, and/or 3) Community Investment Benefit.

WATER SUPPLY BENEFIT

A water supply benefit refers to an increase in the amount of locally available water supply, provided that the increased supply be from previously untreated or uncaptured Stormwater or Urban Runoff.

Community investment benefits may include improved flood management; the creation, enhancement or restoration of parks, habitats, or wetlands; improved access to waterways; or enhanced recreational opportunities, among others.

2. Community Feedback

- Wildfires & Water Quality. Many concerns about the quality of water after wildfires.
- **Presidential Executive Order 14181.** There is now a perception that there is plenty of water in California for Los Angeles. **Concerns as to the efforts of SCWP–why spend millions of** dollars when we already have the water?
- Fires and Native Plants. Discussions about native plants and garden transformations and if these increase probability of spreading fire.



2. Community Feedback

- Wildfire Resistance. Can we consider wildfire resilience as a community benefit? Does it conflict with other SCWP **community benefits?**
- Lario Staging Area in Azusa/Irwindale. Significant community concern about importing hazardous waste to USGR next to SG **River**.
- **Finkbiner Park. Concerns by residents: will artificial turf be part** of the project? Updates by proponents?
- **Green Alleys. SCWP has focused on green streets but green** alleys may serve as key water capture sites.
