I respectfully request your support of Descanso Gardens' Stormwater Capture and Re-Use Project. This is an important water conservation initiative that includes capturing, treating, and storing stormwater in an underground cistern. The water will eventually be directed to refill an existing lake and irrigate the Gardens. When operational, the cistern will capture up to 12.5 acre-feet of water a year.

Descanso Garden's Stormwater Capture and Re-Use Project is one of the few initiatives in LA County's Safe Clean Water Program that combines lake habitat rehabilitation with increasing the local water supply, improving water quality, and protecting public health. Key outcomes of the project include: building a diversion structure to capture and filter stormwater in an underground 220,000 cubic feet cistern; removing sediment and reducing 80% of contaminants, such as zinc and bacteria; improving the lake's condition and habitat; improving flood management and groundwater recharge by redirecting stormwater runoff; increasing Descanso's drought preparedness by reusing excess water for garden irrigation; and offsetting Descanso's reliance on potable water by up to 4 million gallons per year.

Descanso Gardens is visited by over one million people annually. Support from Measure W will provide critical funding for environmental stewardship and the education and enrichment of Descano's visitors about the critical issues facing water access in our region. I urge your favorable consideration of this request.

I hope this message finds you well. This letter is on behalf of the OWLA Coalition to express our strong support for Amigos de los Rios and the continuation of their funding under the Safe Clean Water Program administered by ULAR WASC.

As you know, Amigos De Los Rios has long been a committed partner in environmental justice and water access in the Los Angeles region. Their work has been instrumental in ensuring that underserved communities have access to safe, clean water. However, recent devastating wildfires, including the tragic Palisades fire in January 2025, have put immense strain on their operations. This project exemplifies the goals of Measure W by advancing sustainable water management through the capture, treatment, and reuse of stormwater. It will divert runoff from the Winery Canyon Channel into a 220,000 cubic-foot underground cistern, improve water quality by reducing up to 80% of contaminants, and replenish both the lake and irrigation systems at Descanso Gardens with up to 4 million gallons of non-potable water annually.

This project enhances flood management, boosts drought resilience, and restores critical habitat at one of LA County's most beloved public gardens—all while decreasing reliance on imported water.

This is exactly the kind of innovative, multi-benefit infrastructure investment that deserves Measure W support.

Los Angeles Waterkeeper supports the Scientific Study Proposal "Quantifying Community Flood Management Benefits of Watershed-Scale Stormwater Capture," proposed by the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments. The study will advance our regional understanding of the relationship between SCWP projects and flood mitigation benefits in the watersheds in which they are located, including the development of metrics that can be used to quantify flood management benefits and CIBs for future projects. As the SCWP is undergoing a watershed planning process, understanding watershed-wide flood management needs is an essential component to ensuring the most beneficial projects are located at the most beneficial locations. The public deserves to know the best opportunity sites for stormwater capture projects that may protect flood-prone communities from further risks, particularly as storms get larger and more intense in the coming decades. Such knowledge will also guide flood agencies' decisions on where to prioritize nature-based flood management solutions that can alleviate flood risk while restoring hardened streambeds or other developed sites into a more natural form, suitable for new parks, ecosystem habitat, wetlands, and/or recreation opportunities. The study will be an instrumental first step toward filling a critical knowledge gap, which will facilitate greater effectiveness in our regional hazard mitigation planning efforts for decades to come.
