



#### Safe, Clean Water Program Call for Applications for the Regional Program!


In 2018, citizens within the LA County Flood Control District voted to create the Safe, Clean Water Program (SCWP), which is designed to clean and conserve billions of gallons of stormwater that would otherwise be lost to the ocean when it rains.


The SCWP advances stormwater initiatives that improve water quality, increase our local water supply, and provide community benefits, like green spaces and parks. Each year, the Regional Program of the SCWP accepts applications to fund infrastructure projects, scientific research, and technical assistance. 

## 2. What WC Are Hearing

- Simplify Application & Reporting Processes.
  - Particularly for CBOs.
- Accelerate timelines to be responsive to unexpected events.
  - e.g. wildfire recovery, school greening, flooding.
- Support Restoration & Green Space Acquisition.
  - Hardscape to greenscape.
- Achieve a full spectrum of project sizes and types.
  - Pocket parks, green alleys.



## 2. WC Support for Long Term Goals

- Long-Term Maintenance & Job Creation.
  - Maintenance, limited resources, and employment.
- Initial Watershed Plans Implementation.
  - Be proactive and responsive.
- Support Coordination & Knowledge Sharing.
  - Application engagement with WC.
  - Scientific Studies connection to Infrastructure Projects.
  - Knowledge sharing of completed projects.
