 - Del Rey Neighborhood Council Culver Median Project






EDUCATIONAL WORKSHOP 7/14/25

 funding opportunities.
- We also co-hosted a virtual Community Visioning
 Workshop with We Are R.I.S.E., an environmental youth
 organization, in partnership with the SSMB and LLAR
 Watershed Coordinators.

AUGUST UPDATES

- Partnered with the **Santa Monica–Malibu Unified School District (SMMSD)** and **Amigos de los Rios** to tour five schools in CSMB as potential TRP projects for next year. These schools have already received Community Engagement and Public Education grants from the Water Foundation.
- Participated and presented at LA Waterkeeper's Workshop for the CSMB Watershed to discuss regional priorities and engagement opportunities with local CBOs and nonprofit organizations.











SEPTEMBER UPDATES

- Met with Community Engagement and Public Education grantees from SCWP's Water Foundation grant within the CSMB Watershed. We hosted an information session to share insights about our watershed and provide a collaborative forum for grantees to exchange experiences and learn from one another.
- Assisted SCWP applicants in preparing for their Scientific Study WASC presentations by answering questions, reviewing draft presentations, and providing relevant resources.
- Developed and delivered quarterly **SCWP CSMB Newsletter.**





MICROPLASTICS TOUR












In collaboration with the SSMB and LLAR Watershed Coordinators, we hosted a Microplastics Tour at the DeForest Environmental Education Center in Long Beach, which drew 25 attendees. With support from Dr. Grey, a UCR professor and SCWP Scientific Study recipient, the tour provided education on impacts of pollution and ongoing research efforts to address microplastics in our waterways.

BLUE TABLE TALK EVENT









Our "Blue Table Talk" event was held at Will Rogers Park during Coastal Cleanup Day on September 20th. We spoke with local residents on what they wanted to see more of in LA County, discussed post-fire impacts in neighborhoods with the artist of the Palisades Fire Map and how stormwater projects can help make CSMB more resilient.

OCTOBER UPDATES

- Spoke with potential applicants, including Resilient Palisades and Silver Lake Reservoir Conservancy, about their project ideas in preparation for the City of LA's Intake Form for Community Proposed Letter of Support requests.
- Along with ULAR, SSMB, USGR, LSGR, and SC Watershed
 Coordinators, hosted a virtual SCWP 101 Workshop with recipients
 of the Public Education and Community Engagement grant.
- Conducted outreach at community events including Heal the Bay's
 October Nothin' But Sand Cleanup in Venice Beach and West
 Basin's Water Harvest.
- Provided the closing remarks at the Clear Waters LA: Tackling Harmful Algal Blooms summit.
- Hosted 7th Urban Watershed Working Group meeting with special guests from sCOPE LA and Mujeres de la Tierra discussed environmental justice and culturally relevant community outreach
