- Reviews and evaluates the first four complete fiscal years of SCWP data, building on the 2024 Biennial Report with last two complete fiscal years of reported data.

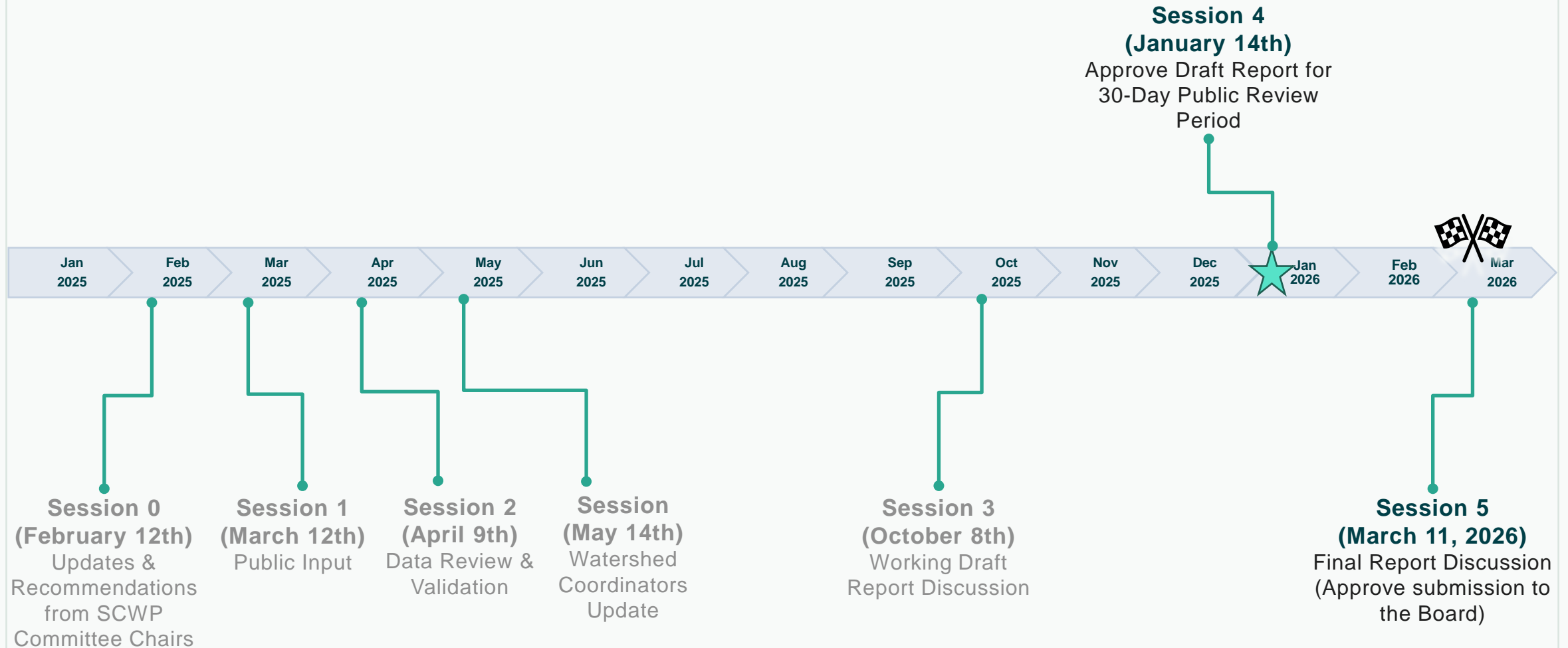

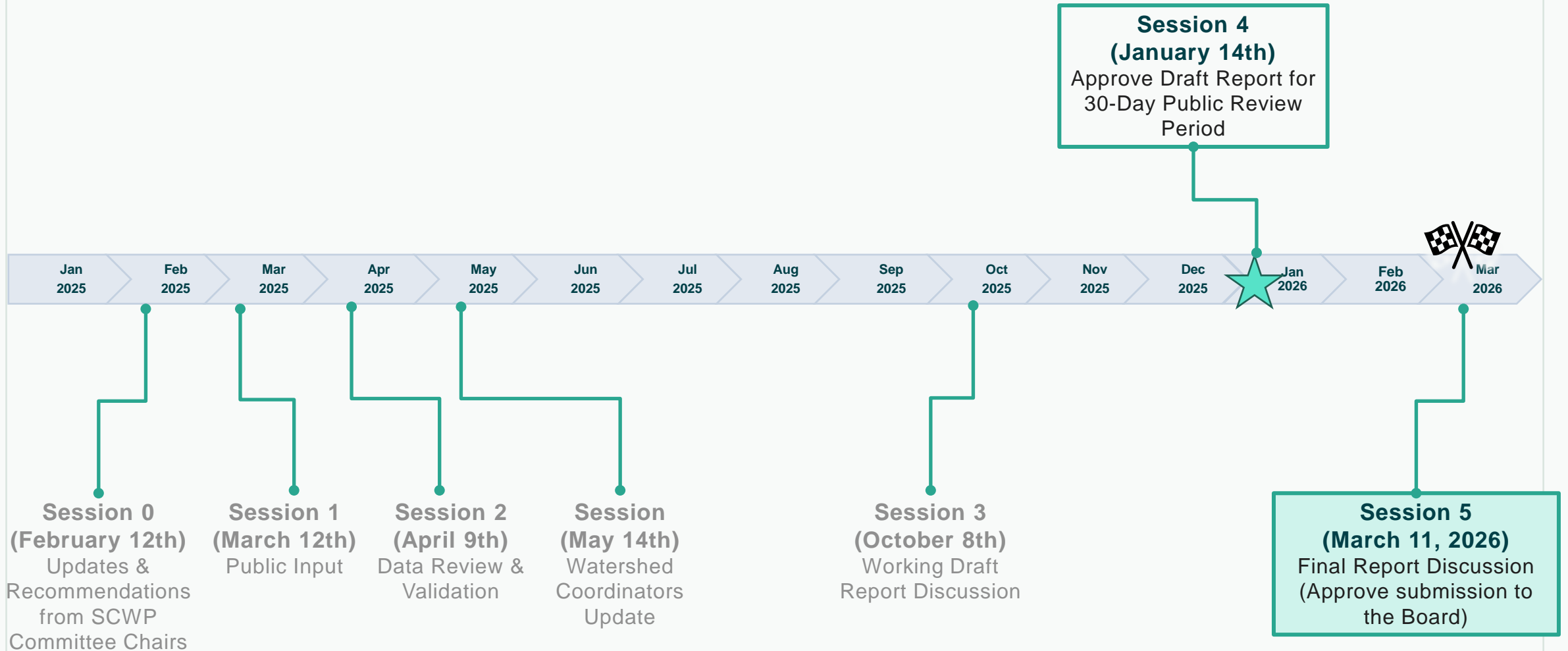
