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1. Welcome and Introductions

Mr. CJ Caluag provided an overview of the WebEx interface and provided instructions for a member of the public to provide a comment during the Public Comment Period. He facilitated roll call voting for attendance and quorum was established.

Mr. David Nahai, the Chair of the Upper Los Angeles River WASC, called the meeting to order.

2. Approval of Meeting Minutes from May 14, 2020

The District provided a copy of the meeting minutes from the previous meeting. Mr. Nahai asked the WASC members for comments or revisions, there were none. Mr. Yazdan Emrani motioned to approve the minutes, Ms. Teresa Villegas seconded the motion. The WASC did a roll call vote to approve the meeting minutes from May 14, 2020 (unanimous).

Note Ms. Cathie Santo Domingo, Mr. Ernesto Pantoja and Mr. Ackley Padilla were not present during this agenda item.

3. Committee Member and District Updates

Mr. Caluag announced that seven out of nine WASCs have approved their Stormwater Investment Plans (SIPs) to date and that the Regional Oversight Committee (ROC) is scheduled to meet on June 18, 2020 and June 24, 2020 to review the SIPs. Mr. Caluag advised the WASC chairs to be in attendance and District staff will invite project applicants to attend the meeting and to be ready to answer any questions brought forth from the ROC.

Mr. Caluag noted that the fund Transfer Agreement templates will be on the Board of Supervisors agenda on June 9, 2020.

Lastly, Mr. Caluag gave an update on the Watershed Coordinator position. He noted that the Request for Statement of Qualifications for the Watershed Coordinator Services is posted on the SCW website and will close on July 20, 2020 at 5:30 PM. Mr. Caluag also noted that 2 webinar proposers conferences are scheduled for June 8 and June 9, 2020.

4. Public Comment Period

Mr. Caluag called on public members that submitted Public Comment Cards to the Safe, Clean Water email prior to the meeting. See attachment for the Public Comment Cards and letters.

Ms. Effie Turnbull Sanders (South Los Angeles Transit Empowerment Zone) expressed support for a project that provides green space, water conservation, and connectivity among communities.

Mr. Shahriar Eftekharzadeh (SEITec) expressed concern and a series of questions on the WASC's evaluation of two infrastructure projects under SIP consideration.

Ms. Sherilyn Correa (City of Los Angeles – Council District 9), on behalf of Office Councilmember Curren D. Price, Jr., expressed support for one project under SIP consideration that will bring much needed investment for South Los Angeles.

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Mr. Edgar Campos (T.R.U.S.T. South Los Angeles) expressed support for the Active Transportation Rail to River Corridor Project investments because of the region's great need of parks and open space and requests.

Mr. Dustin Bambic (Water Resources Engineer) expressed concern for the WASC's process of considering Scientific Studies in the SIP from the project rankings.

Mr. Carlos Moran (TreePeople) expressed similar support for Active Transportation Rail to River Corridor Project investments as mentioned because its equitable distribution of resources for Angelinos.

District staff asked call-in users to speak, but had no response. The public comment letters are attached within these minutes.

5. Discussion Items

a) Ex Parte Communications

The WASC did not have any ex parte communication disclosures.

b) Populate the Stormwater Investment Plan planning tool

Mr. Caluag shared the SIP Planning Tool on the screen with the results that were discussed at the end of the last meeting. This SIP included all projects submitted to the Infrastructure Program and Technical Resources Program, three out of the five Scientific Studies, and three Watershed Coordinator positions. The funding percent allocation for Fiscal Year (FY) 20-21, FY 21-22, FY 22-23, FY 23-24 and FY 24-25 funding was 71 percent, 67 percent, 29 percent, 16 percent, and 10 percent, respectively.

Mr. Nahai reminded the WASC that the current SIP allows the WASC to fund almost all of the projects, while being below the 80 percent funding allocation for the first year. He added that the current SIP would allow for \$16.48M to be used to fund new projects after earmarking 67% of the funds for FY 21-22.

District staff reminded the WASC that the projects submitted to the Technical Resources Program may come to fruition into the Infrastructure Program around year three or four where there is a substantial amount of unallocated funds for future projects during years according to the current SIP.

c) Public Comment Period

Mr. Vic Bapna (CWE) explained why redistributing funds for the City of Fernando Regional Infiltration Project was not possible at this time.

Ms. Diana Mahmud (City of South Pasadena) expressed support for funding Scientific Studies and expressed concern about operation and maintenance costs in the future, which may not be supported by the current percent funding allocations shown on the SIP.

Mr. Shahriar Eftekharzadeh (SEITec) agreed with Ms. Diana Mahmud's comments and expressed support for a more conservative funding allocation.

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District staff asked call-in users to speak, but had no response

d) [Voting Item] - Confirm Final Stormwater Investment Plan

District staff shared a simplified version of the SIP to the WASC members prior to the meeting. The WASC expressed that it was a helpful tool for SIP discussion.

Mr. Nahai motioned to approve the SIP as shown. Ms. Teresa Villegas seconded the motion and it was voted unanimously. The recommended SIP is shown attached.

6. Break

The WASC did not take a break.

7. Items for next agenda



Mr. Nahai invited the WASC members to join him at the ROC meetings. District staff will invite project applicants to the ROC meetings.


8. Adjournment


Mr. Nahai thanked the WASC members and public for their time and participation and adjourned the meeting.

T.R.U.S.T. South LA was established in 2005 as a permanent and democratic steward of land in South Los Angeles. Since its inception the group has expanded its community membership, has raised and dedicated millions in funds in its effort to improve the way of life for thousands of local residents, businesses, and stakeholders. T.R.U.S.T. South LA is a community-based effort that works to stabilize the neighborhoods south of Downtown LA, where increased property values and rents have pushed out many long-term residents. Our mission is to serve as a steward for community-controlled land; to be a catalyst for values-driven, community-serving development; to build awareness and community leadership in issues of housing, transportation and recreation; and to create programs and initiatives that encourage community building and economic opportunity.

On behalf of TRUST South LA and South L.A residents across the 8th and 9th District, I am writing to share that our region in the City of Los Angeles is in great need of parks and open space. According to the Parks Needs Assessment conducted by the County of Los Angeles in 2016 the majority of the district is in high need of additional park, recreation, and open space investments. Considering that parks are a key infrastructure element in improving the quality of life of the community. Residents are eager to identify new park locations and opportunities to bring in the necessary infrastructure improvements the area deserves. As example of our efforts we have put forward \$2M dollars towards acquisition and revitalizing a property adjacent to the railway. After decades post deindustrialization the Rail to Rail Active Transportation Corridor has sat blighted for decades after the Burlington Northern and Santa Fe (BNSF) Railway Company abandoned their rail line and Metro subsequently acquired the right of way in hopes of future redevelopment. The railway extends from the soon to be completed Crenshaw/LAX line to the A-line station at Slauson and Long Beach Avenue.

Our members strongly support the Active Transportation Rail to River Corridor Project —Segment A and Segment B—for consideration of Measure W Regional Program funding. We believe this project will be transformational to our community by promoting economic opportunity and connectivity to green spaces in addition to enhancing water quality. We urge the Committee to consider an equity lens when discussion the communities served by this project and when determining the best use of these tax revenues. Thank you for your consideration.
