



DACTI (Disadvantaged Community and Tribal Involvement Program) in Greater Los Angeles County (GLAC) region - 3 IRWM Regions

- State of California Proposition 1 Water Bond and Integrated Regional Water Management
 - One of the largest state funded water equity projects in California
 - \$4.5M for Project Development
 - \$9M *minimum* for Project Implementation
- Engaging 104 communities across Los Angeles County
 - Economic and environmental distress
 - Participate as equals in planning for local green infrastructure and water sustainability projects
