Comments

- * My name is Elva Yanez, I am board president of Save Elephant Hill, a resident-led, community-based organization that works to preserve open space on Elephant Hill and ensure equitable environmental protections in El Sereno.
- * With the help of the Council on Watershed Health, Save Elephant Hill submitted an application to the Safe Clean Water Program's Technical Resources Program for a feasibility study on 5-acres on Elephant Hill owned by the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority (MRCA).
- * We have received a letter of non-objection from the MRCA, the local conservation agency; a non-objection letter is in progress from the City of Los Angeles. * We have worked collaboratively with organizational allies, other stakeholders and government agencies since 2004; we are trusted by residents living nearby, MRCA and the City of Los Angeles. The organization's leadership has experience with stormwater issues as well as grant and project management.
- * The area to be studied has three natural drainages, permanent presence of groundwater, as well as an intermittent spring and natural drainage and/or water course present at the site.
- * During rainy winters, like 2022-23 season, the underground spring on Elephant Hill fills up and the excess rainwater flows down Pullman Ave., sometimes for months. We would very much like to see this water captured and retained on the hillside using nature-based solutions to prevent bacteria and toxins from running down the street or through people's backyards and into storm drains.
- * We are excited about the possibility of having experts identify potential stormwater infrastructure projects in our community that could be funded by LA County's Safe Clean Water Program in the future.
- * We applaud the Safe Clean Water Program for advancing technical assistance to organizatit
