HIGHLIGHTS FROM LA WATERKEEPER'S SCWP RESEARCH SHOWCASE

July 27th, 2023



Participants included: SCOPE, UCLA Luskin Center for Innovation and Stantec, ARLA Working Group, the Scoring Committee

Highlights

- Consensus around prioritizing hardscape removal and creating new green space, particularly at schools and in park-poor communities
- Many recommendations for adaptive management of scoring, metrics and monitoring
 - E.g. sliding scales for more nuanced scoring, publicly available monitoring dashboard
- Reactive → Proactive approach based on specific watershed and subwatershed "signatures"




ARLA Research:

- Assessed which guidance, criteria, structure, and processes are driving meaningful progress toward SCWP Goals.
- Created "Watershed signatures" to inform investment decisions by suggesting which scenarios maximize benefits and meet local hydrological needs.





SCOPE Research:

- Focused on Equitable Implementation of the SCWP
- Shared rubric to enhance community engagement guidance





ARLA SCWP Working Group

- Assessed the extent to which SCWP guidance, criteria, structure, and processes are successfully driving meaningful progress toward the fourteen SCWP Goals.
- Used custom-built watershed modeling to simulate long-term implementation scenarios.
- Community needs assessment to identify local needs
- "Watershed signatures" can be used to inform investment decisions by suggesting which scenarios maximize benefits and meet local hydrological needs in that particular watershed.

















of funded IPs decreased & projects scaled down.

- in total cost of project
- 24-hour stormwater capacity
- and volume captured
- Leveraging outside funds dropped significantly in Round 3.

Design-only projects increased in Round 3, despite having fewer projects funded overall.





Larger public agencies were better able to navigate the process as others struggle for success

- Only 4 NGOs (out of 8)
- Only 2 Schools (out of 6)

Hardscape removal is not occurring as intended

Only 30.3 acres hardscape removed (out of ~2.6M acres in LA County, 30% hardscape)
