1. Welcome and Introductions

Gina Nila, Chair of the Lower Los Angeles River (LLAR) Watershed Area Steering Committee (WASC), welcomed all Committee Members. District staff conducted a brief tutorial on WebEx and provided an overview of meeting guidelines and participation instructions for any participants joining online. District staff facilitated a roll call, Committee Members made self-introductions, and a quorum was established.

Member Arturo Gonzalez joined the meeting virtually, at 1:06 PM, with just cause under AB 2449.

2. Approval of Meeting Minutes from May 23, 2023

District staff presented the minutes from the previous meeting. Member Madeline Chen motioned to approve, seconded by Member Asha Kreiling. The Committee voted to approve the May 23, 2023 meeting minutes, with 9 votes in favor, 0 opposed, and 5 in abstention, and 3 members absent at the time of vote (approved, see vote tracking sheet).

3. Committee Member and District Updates

District staff provided an update, noting:

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- The first term for WASC Community Stakeholder seats ended on June 30, 2023. District staff
 requested that current Members continue to serve until new members are onboarded. Members
 who are unable to do so should notify District staff. District staff asked Members for patience as the
 procedures are finalized.
- The Board of Supervisors (Board) approved the 9 Stormwater Improvement Plans (SIPs) on August
 8.
- Regional Program Quarterly Reports for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-2023 Q4 were due on August 15 for Infrastructure Program (IP) Projects and Scientific Studies (SS) from Rounds 1 through 3. Quarterly Reports must be completed even if there was no activity on the project or if the Transfer Agreement has not been executed.
- The SCW Portal has been updated to include a "Bids and Schedule" section. The new section includes "Potential Future Bid Opportunities," which features information on upcoming bid opportunities, provided by SCW Project Developers and Municipalities, and "Project Schedules," which features information on construction schedules, provided by Developers and Municipalities.
- The Round 5 Call for Projects application deadline closed on July 31. The LLAR WASC received applications for one IP project and one SS to be considered for this upcoming round.
- The first draft of the LLAR Watershed Area Regional Progress (WARPP) Report has been completed. The WARPP Report is intended to be an extension of the SIP, providing a summary of existing data. All information presented in the WARPP Report is available on the SCW Program website. The WARPP Report will be used to further develop the biennial report that will eventually go to the Board.

4. Watershed Coordinator Updates

Watershed Coordinator Tara Dales presented a summary of FY 24-25 (year 5) Regional Program project submissions, including the Lynwood City Park Stormwater Capture Project and the Identifying Best Practices for Maintaining Stormwater Drywell Capacity Scientific Study. Watershed Coordinator Dales additionally highlighted recent community engagement and outreach efforts. See slides available on the SCW Program website and attached.

Chair Nila noted that the Lynwood City Park Stormwater Capture Project is a discussion item on the agenda and asked if there was an opportunity to further discuss the Identifying Best Practices for Maintaining Stormwater Drywell Capacity Scientific Study. District staff informed the WASC that the Scientific Study will likely be an agenda item for the next meeting.

5. Public Comment Period

District staff compiled all public comment cards received by 5:00pm the day before the meeting. No comment cards were received before the meeting.

Dr. Ali Sharbat (Cal Poly Pomona) provided public comment sharing some background on Cal Poly Pomona's Civil Engineering Program, noting that it has the largest undergraduate program in the nation. Dr. Sharbat noted that the Civil Engineering Department has formed a team comprised of academic and industrial experts mostly focused on stormwater engineering and management. Dr. Sharbat shared that the Civil Engineering Department offers courses and senior projects focused on low impact development, best management practices, and green infrastructure. Regarding the proposed Scientific Study, Dr. Sharbat shared that it will include the evaluation of designs, existing pretreatment practices, and metrics for dry well capacity infrastructure.

Dr. Mehrad Kamalzare (Cal Poly Pomona) provided public comment about the proposed Scientific Study, noting that this type of research is intended to provide information that can be quickly applied to the industry. Dr. Kamalzare shared that the submitted proposal is a 5-year Scientific Study looking to identify best practices for the management of dry wells for the best return of investment. Additionally, Dr. Kamalzare

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pointed out that the proposal has been submitted to different watershed areas with a combined budget request totaling \$4.9 million. Dr. Kamalzare explained that this research would be done within each participating watershed area individually, proportional to the funds provided by a specific watershed.

District staff noted that the Committee may further discuss the study during a future WASC meeting, when the study is incorporated as an agenda item.

6. Discussion Items

a) Ex Parte Communication Disclosure

There were no ex parte communication disclosures.

b) Review of WASC roles and responsibilities

Ryanna Fossum (Stantec, Regional Coordination) gave an overview of the WASC roles and responsibilities. The presentation is available on the SCWP website.

There were no comments or questions.

c) Selection of Chair, Vice-Chair, or Co-Chairs

District staff opened the floor for discussion.

Chair Nila shared with the WASC that she is not interested in continuing as chair for another year and invited Committee Members to voice their interest to step up into the role.

Member Cecilia Salazar shared that Vice-Chair Melissa You, who is not present in this meeting, has expressed interest in continuing as Vice-Chair for the WASC. Vice-Chair You, however, is unable to step up as Chair due to other responsibilities.

Fossum invited Chair Nila to share the responsibilities held by the role. Chair Nila emphasized that the role is a great opportunity to lead and facilitate meetings to ensure productive and professional discussions, and invited Committee Members to step into the leadership role.

District staff noted that having Co-Chairs instead of a Chair and Vice-Chair is also an option. District staff also commented that the District does most of the heavy-lifting to prepare for meetings and tries to support the Chairs' role as much as possible.

Member Kreiling expressed potential interest, but must confirm with their manager before volunteering.

Upon inquiry, District staff noted that there are no term limits and that a current Chair can be reappointed multiple times.

Member Chen expressed interest in the role of Vice-Chair.

Upon inquiry, District staff clarified that the Committee may continue this conversation in the next meeting, with Chair Nila continuing to serve as Chair until a new Member is selected.

d) Watershed Area Regional Program Progress (WARPP) Report FY20-22

District staff shared that the first draft of the WARPP Report has been completed. The report is intended to be an extension of the SIP, providing a summary of existing data. District staff requested input on the WARPP Report. No comments were made.

e) Discuss to send completed feasibility study to Scoring Committee for consideration

Member Gonzalez shared that about 8 years ago, the Rivers & Mountains Conservancy (RMC) approved a grant for the Lynwood Park Stormwater Capture Project and a feasibility study was completed. The study showed that the earth composition of Lynwood Park had a low percolation rate. As a result, the RMC Board voted to transfer the project to an area with a higher percolation rate. Member Gonzalez asked project

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developers to confirm familiarity with the feasibility study and to share how the study is being considered in current work.

John Hunter (John L. Hunter and Associates) noted awareness of such study and clarified that the data showed acceptable, but very low infiltration rates. Hunter shared that only minimal points were given for water supply benefits in the project module because of the low percolation rates. The project is primarily focused on water quality benefits. Hunter explained that the project will do as much infiltration as possible but anticipates that the project will remove sediment to improve water quality, after which the water will be sent back into the storm drain.

There were no public comments.

8. Voting Items

a) Selection of Chair, Vice-Chair, or Co-Chairs

As discussed in item 6C, the selection of Chair, Vice-Chair, or Co-Chairs will be moved to the next meeting.

b) Vote to send completed feasibility study to Scoring Committee for consideration

Member Adriana Figueroa motioned to send the completed feasibility study to the Scoring Committee for consideration. Member Dan Mueller seconded the motion. The motion was passed with 16 votes in favor, 0 opposed, and 1 in abstention (approved, see vote tracking sheet).
