

**Program Details** 

#### Special Parcel tax

- 2.5 cents per square foot of impermeable area
- Watershed-based projects
- Local & Regional Projects



## Regional Program

(50% ~ \$142.5M annually)

### Municipal Program

(40% ~ \$114M annually)

## District Program

(10% ~ \$28.5M annually)

Total Program: Approx. \$280M annually

≤ 5% of funds



# After Four Years, BOS Has Approved:


- 126 Infrastructure Projects


